Westgate Then and Now: Some Disjointed Reflections on Who We Are

September 2022 brought about quite a different look here at Westgate. We began the school year with a new administration team, we welcomed four new teachers and a new counsellor, and we even unveiled a new bouldering wall in the gym.

30 years ago in 1992 marked a different transition, but that was a transition solely for me. That September is when I joined the Westgate community. It feels like a lifetime ago. Indeed, it was definitely a different time: Phone messages were tacked to a bulletin board, our hands were always cracked from chalkboard dust, and the encyclopedias were the prized collections in the library. The one VCR per floor was a coveted item in those days, the tapes showing a blurry image of the film we were using for our classes. I wonder if any of our students today even know that it is kind to rewind.

Although it was a different time in the 90s, it was also eerily the same: the parking lot was too small back then as it is now, but it worked because so many of us rode our bikes or walked to school. That hasn't changed. Back then the staffroom was a loud and boisterous place, with strong theological arguments being posited and political discussions raging. That also is no different than our current staffroom. And I remember being in awe of our small field, packed at lunch with three separate football games going on at the same time, moving seamlessly through one another. Again, that has not changed.

I remember getting to know the school culture, seeing Westgate teachers putting so much time and energy into things like outdoor education and experiences beyond the classroom, and I prayed for the energy to immerse myself in this vision for a school that was

something far beyond an institution locked into traditional forms of learning.

But Westgate was and is more than a school that provides students with


amazing experiences outside the classroom. From the moment I stepped into the school, I found a place in which we could talk about who we are and invite our students to do the same. We continue to this day to talk unabashedly about God's presence in our lives and invite our students to explore that mysterious presence in their own lives. And it is a rewarding and fascinating experience every time.

I recall a number of years ago, I tried to start a chess club. It then turned into a more general games club. Then it turned into a place where games sat on the shelf and the students simply ate their lunches, so they called it the hunger games club. But what it really was was a place of exploration that could happen because of what Westgate is.

Every day, the students in that so-called club would bring some kind of new existential question to the table. In the discussion that followed, the atheists would try to evangelize, the Mennonites would non-violently express their views, and the agnostics would listen and simply say "But maybe not? Who really knows?" In this space, I truly saw the sacred realm that God has helped us create in this school, a place in which religion and belief is not a dogmatic thing nor a private thing, but an exciting and meaningful experience as we discover God's love together.

My mom's chicken noodle soup was always the best. As a little boy, I recall watching her roll out the dough and cut the noodles. Those noodles would come in every shape and size. I loved the ones at the end of the roll that were wide and doughy. It was a spoonful of surprise every time. But as I loved this soup, my mom always said she was embarrassed about her noodle making ability. Her mom, she said, always made the noodles so perfectly, every one precisely the same as if they had come out of a machine. I told her time and time again that she was wrong, that her noodles were perfect, but I don't know if she ever truly accepted that.

I apologize for the soup metaphor that you can see coming, but I am proud to say that we have a great big bowl of my mom's chicken noodle soup going on here at Westgate. Those noodles, our students, are not machine cut, but are varied and expressive and beautiful and unique but still make up something that is far greater than their individual essence. And we love every one of them, every misshapen noodle, because they are perfect as we see the image of God shining forth in all of them. This is our vision for Westgate and this is the beautiful and wonderful arena of learning that we continue to try and recreate every day.

Each one should use whatever gift they have received to serve others,


faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms. -1 Peter 4:10


